- In 2017, the United States exported more goods to China than ever before—more than \$127 billion. Following two years of decreases, US goods exports to China increased by \$14 billion in 2017—a growth rate twice that of exports to the rest of the world.
- US exports of goods to China have grown by 86 percent since 2008. Forty-nine states have increased their goods exports to China in this time period, with 17 states experiencing triple-digit growth since 2008.
- While larger states saw significant growth in goods exports to China, smaller states also benefitted. Alabama, Kentucky, and South Carolina, and Wyoming all saw over 300 percent growth in goods exports to China since 2008.
