Jessica Chen Weiss is the David M. Lampton Professor of China Studies at Johns Hopkins University's School of Advanced International Studies and nonresident senior fellow at the Asia Society Policy Institute Center for China Analysis.

From August 2021 to July 2022, she served as senior advisor to the Secretary's Policy Planning Staff at the U.S. State Department on a Council on Foreign Relations Fellowship for Tenured International Relations Scholars (IAF-TIRS). Weiss is the author of *Powerful Patriots: Nationalist Protest in China's Foreign Relations* (Oxford University Press, 2014). Her research appears in *International Organization*, *China Quarterly*, *International Studies Quarterly*, *Journal of Conflict Resolution*, *Security Studies*, *Journal of Contemporary China*, and *Review of International Political Economy*.

With commentary in the *New York Times*, *Washington Post*, *Foreign Affairs*, *Los Angeles Times*, and the Ezra Klein show, Weiss was profiled by the *New Yorker* and named one of *Prospect Magazine's* Top Thinkers for 2024. Weiss was previously an assistant professor at Yale University and founded FACES, the Forum for American/Chinese Exchange at Stanford University. Born and raised in Seattle, Washington, she received her Ph.D. from the University of California, San Diego.
